Corinium



Corinium is the Roman name for the town of Cirencester, which is close to 'home' for Acoustic Energy. Unlike other floorstanders in the Acoustic Energy range, the range-topping Corinium doesn't space its drivers evenly down the front panel. This means the Tetoron 29mm soft dome tweeter and 120mm carbon fibre midrange act as a a two-way stand-mount in the style of the company's classic AE1 in terms of their relative position and their crossover point. The two 140mm bass drivers at the foot of the cabinet are designed to act as a subwoofer augmenting that two-way stand-mount. It's more complicated than it sounds, and is an ingenious way of combining small speaker speed and floorstander bass power and energy. It's also indicative of Acoustic Energy's long-standing reputation for innovation and performance.

Getting a bit emotional

The Corinium excels in rendering delicate, emotional performances with accuracy and engagement. It manages large-scale pieces well, too, retaining speed and articulation. While the low-frequency performance is defined without being overly heavy. Despite being relatively lean, it provides satisfying depth, notably excelling in heavier electronic music. The Corinium upholds the Acoustic Energy heritage while integrating modern capabilities.

The most impressive part of all, though, is that it has achieved an outstanding performance without forgetting where it has come from. The Acoustic Energy Corinium points out the way of things to come for the company at all the levels. As the Romans say 'Ad Meliora', the
